



# Vaccines Covered for Nunavut Residents 65 Years and Older

Vaccines	National Recommendations	Coverage Details <sup>1</sup>
<b>COVID-19</b>	At least 1 dose of either Comirnaty or Spikevax COVID-19 vaccines per year	Spikevax is available for free for older adults
<b>Influenza</b>	1 dose of either Fludac or Fluzone High-Dose per year	Fluzone High-Dose is available for free for older adults
<b>Pneumococcal (Pneumonia)</b>	1 dose of either Prevnar 20 or Capvaxive <sup>2</sup>	Prevnar 20 is available for free for older adults
<b>RSV</b>	1 dose of either Abrysvo, Arexvy or mRESVIA can be used based on personal factors	Vaccines are not available for free for older adults
<b>Shingles</b>	2 doses of Shingrix	Shingrix is not available for free for older adults, except for certain Veterans <sup>3</sup> and Indigenous <sup>4</sup> older adults
<b>Tetanus and Diphtheria</b>	Immunization history will determine the type of vaccine and the number of doses needed	Vaccines are available for free, including for older adults every 10 years

<sup>1</sup> If you have a private drug plan, it may cover the cost of vaccines that are not publicly covered.

<sup>2</sup> Recommendations vary for older adults who have received a hematopoietic stem cell transplantation.

<sup>3</sup> Eligible Veterans may be covered for this vaccine through Veterans Affairs Canada.

<sup>4</sup> Eligible First Nations and Inuit may be covered for this vaccine through Indigenous Services Canada's Non-Insured Health Benefits (NIHB) Program.
